DISASTERS AND EMERGENCIES CAN AND DO HAPPEN WITHOUT WARNING HOW READY ARE YOU?

On Thursday, May 22, I watched the news as severe thunderstorms rolled through Prince George's County where a tornado warning was issued for Bowie. Some of you have shared with me how you took shelter in your basements upon being notified of the impending storms.

Having grown up in the tornado belt along the Ohio River, memories of a tornado destroying property on either side of the house I grew up in flashed through my mind. More than once we took shelter in the basement and then would wait what seemed like an eternity before we knew everyone in the family was safe.

As I prayed for you, I began to wonder:

- * How many of you have a family emergency plan?
- * How will contact be made among your family members during and after an emergency?
- Do you have enough non-perishable food and water for five days? This includes one gallon of water per person per day.
- Do you have important documents and papers that are password protected on a flash drive or stored in a cloud?
- Do you have emergency kits for the home, office, and car? If so, do you check the expiration dates of the contents every 6 months? Do you know the recommended content for each kit?
- Do you know how to respond if disaster impacts your home or workplace? Your child(ren)'s school(s)?
- * Are you familiar with how to know if the church is impacted? Are you aware that every UPB WEEKLY UPDATE includes information about inclement weather/emergency closings?
- For those of you who live in PG County, are you registered for Notify Me Prince George's? "When a major event or emergency occurs, the Prince George's County Office of Homeland Security will alert registered users via Notify Me Prince George's. Notify Me Prince George's will provide updates on active events and if required, instructions on where to go, what to do, what not to do, who to contact and other important information." I encourage you to do so and follow the recommendations.



As some of you know, I serve as a Chaplain for the Fairfax County Office of Emergency Management and the Fairfax County Police Department. I am most appreciative for the training I have received in the area of disaster preparedness.

Over the last few years, I have seen the impact on individuals and families when disaster and emergencies have occurred with and without warning; disasters such as:

- ★ House and apartment fires
- Flooding of communities where people had massive cleanups and/or were not permitted to return to their homes for several days
- ★ Earthquake damage
- ★ Snowmageddon
- Threats of terrorism, including 9/11 and the sniper shootings
- Hurricanes and tornadoes remember La Plata?
- ★ The Navy Yard shooting
- More than one airplane has crashed into the Potomac; and there have been serous bus, train, and Metro-Rail accidents

In the DC Metropolitan area we laugh and run to the store at the threat of the first snowflake, It *might* snow means shelves containing milk, bread, toilet paper, and adult beverages are quickly emptied.

Friends, since we live in an area where natural and humankind disasters occur, the question is not IF a disaster or emergency will occur, the question is WHEN will it occur and will you be ready?

In my times spent on call and working disaster situations, one thing has become very clear to me: one's ability to cope during a disaster or an emergency is related to two very specific areas: one's level of preparation and one's faith and relationship with the Lord.

May you and your family be prepared for the inevitable. May you continue to grow and mature in your faith. God bless you. If you would like to discuss Disaster Preparedness in greater depth, let's do so.
